The St. Bernard Parish Sheriff's Office (the Parish) asked the Board to arbitrate a dispute between it and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) arising out of the Parish's request for a public assistance grant under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. § 5172 (2006), for reimbursement of costs incurred as a result of Hurricane Katrina.

On May 7, 2010, the Board received a letter from counsel for the Parish, along with a motion and order of dismissal with prejudice, advising the Board that the Parish and FEMA had reached a settlement in the above-captioned proceeding and seeking a dismissal with prejudice of the proceeding.
