ORDER

The Department of Justice's Federal Bureau of Prisons entered into a requirements contract with Ruiz Protective Services, Inc. (Ruiz) for the provision of guard services to inmates held at two facilities in Texas, Federal Correctional Institution Fort Worth and Federal Medical Center Carswell. The bureau ordered considerably more hours of guard services than originally contemplated, causing Ruiz to incur additional direct and indirect costs for overtime and administrative matters. Ruiz claimed that it was entitled to \$2,390,596.96 to cover its additional costs. On December 22, 2009, Ruiz filed an appeal with the Board from the deemed denial of its claim.

After protracted negotiations, the parties have agreed to settle the case, with the Bureau of Prisons paying \$589,471.88 to Ruiz. Ruiz has filed a motion for dismissal of the case.

Accordingly, the appeal is **DISMISSED**.
