DRUMMOND, Board Judge.

This appeal was from a contracting officer's decision regarding a claim submitted by appellant, Sigal Construction Corporation (Sigal), on behalf of itself and various subcontractors, to respondent, the General Service Administration (GSA), for \$1,519,803. The claim relates to contract no. GS11P03MKC0047 for renovation and improvement work at the Harry S. Truman (Old State) Building in Washington, D.C.

On September 16, 2010, the parties filed a “Stipulation for Judgment; Joint Certificate of Finality,” which states:

The parties jointly stipulate that Judgment should be entered in favor of . . . Sigal Construction Corporation in the amount of \$1,100,000, inclusive of costs, attorneys fees, and interest allowable under the Contract Disputes Act, 41 U.S.C. §§ 601, *et seq.*

Pursuant to Rule 31 of the Board’s . . . Rules of Procedure, the parties further certify that they shall not seek review or reconsideration of judgement so rendered. With respect to the decision of the Board issued pursuant to this stipulation, the parties waive their rights to reconsideration under Rule 26, rights to relief from judgment under Rule 27, and rights to appeal the decision.

Accordingly, the appeal is **GRANTED IN PART**. In accordance with the parties’ joint stipulation, the Board awards Sigal the sum of \$1,100,000, inclusive of costs, attorneys fees, and interest under the Contract Disputes Act of 1978, 41 U.S.C. §§ 601-613 (2006), to be paid from the permanent indefinite judgment fund, 31 U.S.C. § 1304.
