ORDER

In CBCA 1662-ISDA, appellant, Passamaquoddy Tribe–Indian Township (the Tribe), challenges a May 1, 2009, final decision of the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) awarding official demanding repayment of \$421,673 in costs questioned in an audit report for the fiscal year (FY) ending September 30, 2006. CBCA 4124-ISDA involves the Tribe’s challenge to a June 18, 2014, decision questioning \$132,975 in costs for the FY ending September 30, 2007. The Tribe has notified the Board that the Department of Justice approved a settlement of the disputes underlying these appeals and that the parties subsequently executed a settlement agreement and fulfilled their obligations under that agreement. The Tribe asks that we now dismiss the appeals with prejudice.

The Tribe's motion is granted. These appeals are **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE**.
